

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Supply Ideas by Chris Schiefelbein. John Sullivan and James Riopel





I recently received a frantic Friday phone call from the softball equipment department at Texas A&M University. Their maroon/white uniforms bled, and their sleeves turned pink. The Adidas rep said: "Call A.L. Wilson Chemical Co." We solved that issue that day, with YellowGo.

Derek from Texas A&M told me "I'm going to get your products, and when I do, I want you to show me how to use it." Yesterday was YellowGo training day in the equipment department.

Using a plastic 4-gallon clear container, gloves, COLD water, YellowGo, and RustGo, in 2 hours we cleaned 50 stained multi-colored softball uniforms. Here's how:

Step 1: Thoroughly rinse the uniforms; this frees the dirt and dust particles from the uniforms.

Step 2: Before using YellowGo, watch training videos at www.ALWilson.com. Click YellowGo bottle. Scroll down to the videos.

Step 3: Add 2 oz of YellowGo for every gallon of water. Add a squeeze of RustGo. (RustGo helps flush the purple/black stripper out of the fabric.) Soak uniforms until red clay is removed. 5-10 minutes. Flex the material against itself for stubborn areas, i.e. lettering or stained numbers.

Step 4: Rinse well, then wash as usual.

For eye black stains, field paint stains, pine tar stains, and grass stains, we used Laundry TarGo. We simply applied Laundry TarGo directly to the stain. You may flex the material if needed, then wash out

MCC Service Tips

Troubleshooting Rear-burner Dryers

Huebsch and Speed Queen stacked 30# or 45# dryers, as well as non-stacked 25, 30, 35 and 55# tumbler dryers, all utilize a rear-burner design. These models all utilize support rollers under the dryer basket rather than a long trunnion.

One of the more common issues with rear-burner dryers is vibration issues; if you experience such issues:

- · Check for lint on blower blades
- Check to see if the housing is cracked or damaged
- Check to see if the mounting plate is loose
- Check out the motor bearings; in rare circumstances, you may need to consider replacing the motor.

A second common issue is a "scraping" noise during operation. This can be due to several things:

- Check to see if dryer is overloaded—if so, it may be causing the basket to scrape the front panel.
- · Check for excessive lint, foreign objects in cylinder, blower blade issues or cracked housing.
- Look for damaged or worn roller wheels under the dryer basket. This may also cause vibration issues.
- Check the idler bearing on the back of the dryer on the basket shaft—replace if worn.

Stacked Tumblers: Roller and Seal Kit

If your Huebsch/Speed Queen stacked tumbler is making a loud noise, it could be that you need a new roller and seal kit.

Checking your rollers is easy—installing new rollers is simple. The rollers can be found by the lint compartment. These rollers are used on stack tumblers- 35 lb-55 lb and single pocket dryers.

The roller kits now come with a felt seal to protect against lint build up. The roller kits also come with instructions.

Huebsch: How Do I Get Started in the Laundromat Business?

It might not be a glamourous business option, but it definitely is a recession-and-pandemic-proof one.

Opening a laundromat is a relatively low-risk investment, with many studies putting the success rate for laundromats at nearly 95 percent. It's clear that opening a laundromat can be very profitable. In fact, U.S. laundromats experience an average cash-on-cash ROI of 20 to 35 percent.

So how do you get started in the business?

Do your homework. Do extensive research on the business and financing options. (Start-up costs can vary widely, but will likely run \$100,000-\$300,000.) Visit and use laundromats in the area you are considering. What do you like or dislike? Is a niche open that would make you stand out from the competition? Start working on your business plan to make sure you've covered every contingency.

Decide what services you want to provide. Is it just self-service washers and dryers? How about dry cleaning, wash-dry-fold service, or pickup and delivery services? Also decide on what other amenities you want to include. Maybe a children's play area, vending area, a WiFi bar, ample seating, or lots of carts and folding tables?

Work with Minnesota Chemical for expert guidance. Once you know how much space you'll need, start looking for a building or building site that offers easy parking, good visibility and is near your likely customers. Your MCC vended specialist will be happy to walk you through the whole process!





Calculate your expenses and purchase equipment. Remember, today's laundromats are a balance of equipment and open space. Work with your budget and create an environment that is balanced. And remember, you get what you pay for. So, while you can save money upfront with cheaper models, more-expensive models will often cost less in the long run when you include maintenance and repair costs.

Dot the I's and cross the T's. That includes getting all the legal paperwork and necessary licenses and permits completed, from registering your business, to obtaining federal and state tax ID numbers, construction permits, sewer connections, and so on. Again, this is where an experienced, full-service distributor can help you navigate the complex world of permitting.

Buy insurance. You've made a big investment. Don't skimp on insurance. If you will be hiring employees, you'll also need workers' compensation and unemployment insurance.

Market your new laundromat. Create (or hire someone to create) a company website, open social media accounts (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter) and register a Google profile, which will allow you to add pictures of your business, and respond to customer reviews/address customer concerns. Also consider TV, radio or print advertising, billboards, or flyers and posters that could be distributed to other locations your potential customers frequent. Word-of-mouth advertising can also be very effective, so think of ways to reward current customers who recommend others to try your services. Try a variety of tactics (make sure you can measure their effectiveness) and see what works for your business.

Re-evaluate. Don't hesitate to make necessary changes as you learn what works and what doesn't. That includes marketing and operational changes.

Yes, starting and running a laundromat is work. But it is work you can enjoy and make a good living at, too, all while adjusting the business to your schedule.
