I am so excited about writing to you. Winter is over and I am glad. We had a wonderful, wonderful holiday because of your generosity. Everyone got their wish including all children to adults.



It wasn't until middle school I learned Mary's Place was a shelter where homeless families could call home until they found more stable housing. After teaching in South Korea for 2.5 years, I knew I wanted to work for a non-profit focused on helping the community. Mary's Place came to mind. I saw on their website they were hiring so I decided to give it a try. 4 months later, I'm still here, working as a Family Advocate and Classroom Assistant. My favorite part of the job is getting to know the children and interacting with them daily. Despite having experienced many challenges at a young age, they remain resilient individuals, absorbing

and processing the world around them in the safe haven provided by Mary Jo. Mary Jo is not only a valued community member but also a protector, serving as a mother or grandmother figure to many. When all hope seems lost, she is there to lift you up and help you get back on your feet. She is willing to take chances and offer opportunities to those who may appear undeserving by societal norms."

MEET ARCHIE & FAMILY

The Florida Department Of Children And Families contacted Archie to come get his young daughters (who had been bouncing around from place to place or sleeping in a car with their mother). At the time, he was living with his aunt. He brought the girls back to her house and he made a plan to move to Minnesota with the money he had saved so the three of them could have a fresh, new start. When they arrived here, he thought he could stay with his sister until he could get on his feet, but that fell through. His sister connected him to a local church and the pastor let them sleep there a few nights. The pastor called Sharing and Caring Hands and said he was sending a family in need. When they walked in, Archie remembers Mary Jo saying, "Come in! I'm going to help



remembers Mary Jo saying, "Come in! I'm going to help Archie, Maryam (age 6), & Martha (age 4) you!" Archie says, "When Mary Jo welcomed us it was like the doors of heaven opened. All of a sudden we had a beautiful apartment and everything was now going to fall into place." Archie got both girls into school and daycare, he has rebuilt his savings, joined the church choir, is job searching, and had an interview for affordable housing. Archie says, "Mary Jo is my mother. She is amazing, so helpful, and wonderful. I wish there was a place like this in every state!"


