Pastor's Message

Shining Christ's Light

This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine... We call ourselves here at Trinity "the light on the hill." And with the program year about to start—Sunday School, Confirmation, Choir, Small Groups—the light will be shining bright. (Literally, because there will be much more busyness in the church building, especially in the evenings and the days getting shorter, our lights will be on!)

This past June your council met for a retreat to think about who we are as a congregation and what God is calling us to be and do. One of the big take-aways from our meeting was realizing that we were missing a key word in our "the light on the hill" moniker. We're not just any light on the hill, we are Christ's light on the hill. We also discussed how are we best shining Christ's light?

Put it under a bushel- No! I'm gonna let it shine... as the children's song reminds us, how are we positioning ourselves to best shine Christ's light? We had a discussion around church size and accompanying church organizational structure. We came to the conclusion that we are right in between a pastoral-size congregation and a program-size congregation. And there is a difference between the functioning of those sizes. And your council has decided that we are a program-size church. We have a phenomenal Sunday School program (many thanks to Steph Johnson who puts her heart and soul into kid's ministry) and we see our congregation growing into the future. We have partnered with Standing Rock and now with the Crossroads Parish of Marion, Litchville and LaMoure. We have the potential to shine Christ's light far and wide.

But this means shifting our approach to day-to-day operations and functioning, so that we can ensure Christ's light is shining unimpeded. Are we approaching this like a big church or a small church? is a question that your office staff, executive committee and council keep asking. In smaller churches, an office administrator might come in once or twice a week to check voicemail and compose and print bulletins. As part of a larger church, support staff roles are expanded to include strategic planning and leadership. Work gets taken home. Staff are empowered to make decisions in their ministry areas. Leaning into a program-size, big church model will require us to shift how our council and staff function.

Growth requires change, and things get messy once in a while, but the whole reason we are here is because of Christ. And Christ is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. He gives us his grace and mercy, and we are able to show ourselves and others grace and mercy as a result. His light does not go out! Jesus gave it to me, I'm gonna let it shine...

MISSION AND VISION

Continuing the Conversation Over the summer, Trinity's council leadership has been engaging in thoughtful conversation around our mission and vision. As I like to share with congregation; Vision is where we are going, and mission is how we get there. These conversations are not just about strategic planning - they're about discerning how God is calling us to serve. August 11th Council Meeting Highlights

Stewardship- An Education CD totaling \$1,822.23 was approved to be divided among S.S, VBS, Confirmation, and Youth programs.

Worship- Preparations are underway for the Backpack Blessing service happening in August. Property-The parking lot project was completed earlier than expected and has been fully paid for. Youth- Confirmation begins on Wednesday, September 10th with a parent meeting.

Education

- Vacation Bible School was a success with 32 youth helpers and 45-50 children attending.
- The Post-Youth Lock-In also went well.
- Next focus: Rally Sunday on September 14th.

Evangelism

- Planning underway for the Fair Parade on the 23rd.
- Preparations also in progress for Rally Sunday on September 14th.
- Approved \$250 to support a community need sponsoring a children's movie at the Historic Scenic Theater as part of the Ty & Katelyn Michel fundraiser.

Other Updates

- The Refresh Committee will begin small updates to the Narthex.
- The Standing Rock contract remains unchanged and will be reviewed at the Annual Meeting.
- The Head Start and South Valley contracts have been updated and reviewed.
- A written procedure policy for providing rides to church was presented.
- Harvest Fest is scheduled for October 12th, with proceeds allocated to Narthex improvements.
- Discussion was held on council endorsement and potential sponsorship of Jenn Jordan's participation in the Rural Leadership of North Dakota program through NDSU Extension still under consideration.
- Brief discussion on new nominations for upcoming council openings.

7th & 8th grade will meet on September 10th at 6:00 pm.


9th graders and their families will meet at 7:00 pm.


